Tyngsborough Zero Waste Day is an opportunity for residents to keep usable goods out of the waste stream. By partnering with local reuse organizations, durable goods can be used again and again, reducing the amount of trash we generate and the natural resources required to produce new goods.

ACCEPTED ITEMS LIST

GENTLY USED FURNITURE & HOUSEHOLD GOODS

Items collected will benefit the Household Good, Inc. of Acton (who will donate to those in need)

Items must be like new or gently used

- Furniture (dressers, tables, chairs)
- Mattresses (NO rips, tears or stains - tears in mattress foundation okay)
- Bed Frames (must include all parts and hardware)
- Dishes, flatware & kitchen items
- Sheets, towels (like new, no rips or stains)
- **Working** small kitchen appliances (coffee makers, blenders, toasters, etc.)
- **Working** DVD players, radios & TV's less than 10 years old and smaller than 55" (must have plug and stand).
- **NO items with glass tops, cribs, desks or office furniture**

ELECTRONICS & SMALL APPLIANCES

Small donation requested. Sponsored by Scout Troop 46. NO TVs or CRTs.

- Monitors (No TVs)
- Stereos/ Radios
- Cables/ Power Cables
- Video Games
- Computers
- Cell Phones - working or not (please let us know and bring power cord if working)
- Speakers
- Small Appliances
- Microwaves
- Toaster Ovens
- Vacuums
- Dehumidifiers
- Dorm Refrigerators
- Large Subwoofers

TEXTILES, BOOKS & MORE

Items collected with benefit the Big Brother, Big Sister Foundation and will be either reused or recycled by CMRK, Inc.

Please bring the following items IN BAGS. Stained or worn/torn in fine. Items that cannot be reused will be responsibly recycled.

- Shoes/Footwear (singles or in pairs)
- Men's, Women's & Children's clothing
- Hats, belts, gloves
- Wallets, purses, backpacks, totes
- Watches & Jewelry
- Towels, linens, bedding
- Throw rugs, placemats
- Curtains and drapes
- Stuffed animals
- Halloween costumes

Please bring the following items IN BOXES

- Pots/pans, dishes, glassware
- Small home decor items
- Small musical instruments
- Books, DVDs (NO Encyclopedias, magazines or VHS tapes)

Please bring unpackaged

- Suitcases

SCRAP METAL

Items collected by Junk King - Available until dumpster is full

- Items that are primarily metal
- Metal rakes, shoves, rebar
- Snowblowers, lawnmowers (drain all fluids first)
- Stoves, dishwashers, washers & dryers
- **NO TVs, refrigerators, safes, and nothing containing oil or fluids**

BIKES & BIKE PARTS

Collected items to benefit The Bike Connector, a Lowell-based non-profit with a mission to make bicycling accessible for all. Visit www.bikeconnector.org to learn more. Bikes that are too rusty or damaged to be reused will be recycled with scrap metal.

- **Bicycles** that are "serviceable" - no bent frames or stuck seat posts
- **Bicycle Parts** - spare parts and components, including tubes, tires, wheels, chains, pedals, saddles, kickstands, racks and handlebars
- **Bicycle Accessories** - Helmets (new only), tire pump locks and chains for locks, gloves, bicycle books & manuals
- **Tools** - General hand tools and specialized bike tools

SMALL ENGINES

Provided by a local resident. Items will be repaired and reused. Items that cannot be repaired or used for parts will be recycled with scrap metal.

- Snowblowers
- Riding mowers
- Leaf blowers
- Generators
- Chain saws
- ATVs and dirt bikes
- Snowmobiles
- Pressure washers

NO PUSH MOWERS or WEED WHACKERS/ STRING TRIMMERS.

OTHER ITEMS

- Eyeglasses & Sunglasses
- Skis/Snowboards
- Golf clubs
- Water skis
- Wooden oars and paddles
- Wooden bats
- Metal license plates and hub caps

Frequently Asked Questions:

Can I bring items not on this list? No. Only the items specifically listed and accepted by our vendors and volunteers can be left at the event. Items that cannot be accepted will need to remain with the resident. There is no general purpose dumpster on site.
